Responsible Staff

The Headmistress is responsible for the provision of First Aid at St Mary's. This responsibility is delegated as follows:

First Aid Coordinator: Bursar

First Aid Technical Advisor: Senior School Nurse First Aid Training Coordinator: Senior Deputy Head

Department First Aid: Head of Department (Appointed Persons)

First aiders Volunteer staff

Appointed Persons

There is a requirement for the school to nominate specific members of staff as Appointed Persons. All Departmental Heads are nominated Appointed Persons. The Appointed Person is not a First Aider but is someone nominated to take charge when someone is injured or becomes ill. At St Mary's the Appointed Person is responsible for:

- Coordinating the immediate response to a First Aid incident in conjunction with a First Aider;
- Informing the School Nurse of a First Aid incident;
- Calling an ambulance or other professional help should the incident require it;
- With the School Nurse, checking the restocking of First Aid containers in their area of responsibility;
- Ensuring an accident form is completed after an incident. The Accident Reporting Policy details the procedures for reporting accidents and for notifying parents if pupils are involved in an accident.

RIDDOR

The Bursar is responsible for the School's compliance with the Reporting of Injury, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 1995 as detailed in the Accident Reporting Policy in the Staff Employment Manual.

Risk Assessments

The Bursar, Senior Deputy Head and Senior School Nurse are jointly responsible for carrying out the School first aid needs assessment and associated risk assessment which informs this policy document. In particular the first aid needs assessment must consider the number of first aiders, number and locations of first aid containers, arrangements for off-site activities/trips and out-of-hours arrangements such as lettings. The first aid needs assessment can be found at **Annex B**.

All staff responsible for activities or areas within the School are required to carry out appropriate risk assessments. These risk assessments should, where appropriate, include provision for the requirement for first aid.

St Mary's First Aid Policy has three main features:

- First aid administered by the school nurse who staffs the Health Centre 24 hours a day during term time.
 The nurse can be contacted on Ext 608 or via reception Ext 600. The nurse should always be contacted if first aid is required. However, if safe to do so, the patient should be escorted to the Health Centre.
- First aid administered by staff (academic and support staff) who hold an up-to-date first aid qualification.
 First aid qualified staff may administer first aid if the nurse is not present or cannot be contacted such as when the nurse is attending to another person, the accident happens on a trip or it is not term time.
 Members of staff are not permitted to give out any medicines, painkillers or other drugs to pupils without the permission of the school nurse.
- Advice for staff and pupils who might be first at the scene of an accident or an emergency. Staff who may be the first person at the scene of an accident or an emergency must try to contact the nurse or a first aid qualified member of staff. In the absence of either of these persons, they should decide whether to wait for either of the above people or call an ambulance. An ambulance should be called in any situation where a pupil or member of staff is unconscious, where there is a large amount of blood, suspected neck or back injury or if there is any indication that the pupil or member of staff need urgent medical attention.

Trained First Aiders

The main duty of a first aider at St Mary's is to help casualties with injuries or illness and when necessary to ensure that the school nurse or an ambulance or other professional help is called.

The school's assessment of first aid needs (Reference E) concludes that the minimum first aid trained personnel that are required on site are:

As a matter of routine, the school seeks to exceed this number of first aid trained staff to ensure that coverage is not compromised due to staff absence. The list of trained staff can be found at **Annex A** and on notice boards around the school.

The Senior Deputy Head holds the master list of all trained first aid staff. All staff trained in first aid are required to update their training every 3 years or in accordance with their qualification certificate.

Training

The Senior Deputy Head is responsible for the provision and recording of annual and continuation First Aid training. Continuation Training is provided on the basis of hourly sessions on different topics each term for which qualified First Aiders may sign up. In addition the school nursing staff will make available informal refresher training when requested.

Staff who are responsible for pupils with conditions such as hayfever, asthma, diabetes and epilepsy are informed of pupils with such medical conditions and the appropriate treatment to be administered in an emergency. This information is updated by the school nurse at the beginning of each academic year, on every external trip from school and throughout the year as necessary.

Pupils

Pupils are made aware of first aid issues through the Skills for Life programme.

Staff

Staff should ensure that any personal medications that they may need in school are kept securely in a locked drawer and are administered privately out of view of pupils.

First Aid Kits

The person responsible for ensuring that first aid containers and bodily spills kits meet laid down statutory requirements is the school nurse. The school nurse, in conjunction with the relevant Appointed Person, is responsible for ensuring that these First Aid kits are kept in a clean and serviceable condition and are properly stocked.

Off-Site Activities

The arrangements for school trips and off site activities can be found in the Health and Safety on School Trips Policy. Key elements with regard to first aid are as follows:

- Pre-book a first aid kit from the school nurse.
- Advise the school nurse of the pupils on the trip in order to obtain any essential medical information.
- One member of the staff for the trip must be a first aider if the group are unable to rely on first aid support from another reputable source. For example, a trip to a local theatre would not require a first aider but a Geography Field Trip to an isolated location would require one. If in doubt advice from the Bursar should be sought.
- Any need for vaccinations should be established well in advance.

Letting Organisations and Contractors

External organisations that use facilities at St Mary's and Contractors working on the site are required to provide their own first aid trained staff. St Mary's School first aid boxes are available for use by all visitors.

Insurance

The Bursar is responsible for ensuring the school has adequate insurance to cover claims arising from actions of staff acting within the scope of their employment.

First Aid Environment

Geography

St Mary's School Ascot is a girls boarding school set on a single semi-rural 55 acre site in South Ascot, Berkshire. The grounds consist mainly of school buildings, playing fields and light woodland.

Numbers

There are 400 pupils aged from 11 to 18. There are 250 employees of which many are part time or peripatetic. For first-aid ratio calculations it would be sensible to assume a maximum of 150 staff on site at any one time. The Rose Theatre will occasionally host events with audiences of approximately 300. During the school holidays numbers of employees and contractors on site fluctuates but for first aid planning a maximum of 50.

Hazards

Within the school environment there are a number of potentially increased hazard areas i.e. the science department, food technology kitchen and swimming pool and not accessible to the pupils the maintenance/grounds department workshops and main kitchen. In addition, there are more routine hazards present such as slips and trips and sports injuries.

Pupils and Staff

A number of pupils have underlying health conditions such as asthma, diabetes and allergies. These are well known to medical staff, pastoral staff and Heads of House and briefed on an as required basis to other staff such as teaching staff. Employees with a specific medical condition with implications for first aid will be

consulted in order that other members of staff, and in particular first aiders and school nurses, can be briefed appropriately. For example, there is currently a member of staff who has had a transplant and therefore key members of the school staff are alert to her condition.

School Trips

The school pupils will take part in numerous school trips whilst attending St Mary's. These will include away matches, residential and non-residential field trips, Duke of Edinburgh Award expeditions and weekend events off site (such as theatre trips). The school has a fleet of three minibuses and a school car.

Medical Support

During term time there is a school nurse on duty 24 hours a day. The Bracknell Urgent Care Centre is 4.5 miles away (approximately 13 minutes in normal traffic). Frimley Park Hospital is 6.8 miles away (approximately 16 minutes in normal traffic). Routinely the ambulance service can reach the school promptly within 30 minutes although at busy times for non-urgent calls the wait can exceed 2 hours.
